A Mini Travel Guide

On the Cape is a short publication, meant to be used as a mini travel guide to reference while visiting little known attractions in Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

While it can be used simply to read about these locations, it is purposed to be carried with the reader as a reference while they navigate to these secret sites.

Paranormal researcher and university lecturer Derek Bartlett offers interactive ghost hunting tours within Barnstable village. Bartlett provides guests with flashlights and electronic voice pheno-menon recorders that are intended to pick up voices from the dead. The entrance to the cemetery, called 'death's doorway,' is made of iron, as colonial Americans thought ghosts couldn't pass through iron. They also believed that anyone entering the cemetery with the deceased would be cursed. To avoid this, coffins were slid on two stone pillars into the graveyard.

This 1690 jailhouse, also featured as part of Bartlett's tour, is the oldest wooden jail in the country, haunted by the ghosts of its former residents. He brings the tour group to this site after hours, and turns off the lights and beckons the ghosts to come out and play. He also tells ghost stories to the attendees in the dark, who sometimes scream and claim something has grabbed them. There is even an option to stay the night here, from 9pm to 1am. Visitors will find etchings carved into the wooden walls as well as quite a horrifying exhibit on Colonial era punishments.

This Victorian mansion built by a sea captain became a speakeasy and brothel run by the Irish mafia in the 1920s. Rumor has it that a prostitute was murdered by a customer, and the manor, now an inn and restaurant, has been haunted by her ever since. By the time Ed and Laurie Maas bought the property in 1996, it had been abandoned. The couple had planned to tear it down but soon discovered that the place was haunted and decided to restore it. A team from the Syfy Channel's Ghost Hunters show arrived in 2010, recording ghostly voices and shadows.

ain Bang's Portrait allet House interior Rows of century-old sea captains' houses stretch along the Old King's Highway for over a mile, but only one is open to the public: the Captain Bangs Hallet House. A sea captain in the China -India trade, Hallet had his portrait painted in Canton, China by a well known Chinese artist, Lam Qua. The house, which is set up to depict the Hallet family's Victorian-era life, was once the unlikely scene of an art heist. Two thieves snatched the Captain's portrait, along with five additional 19th-century paintings, in 1988. To date, the culprits have not been caught and the paintings have not been recovered.

Nantucket's pair of Greek Revival mansions, known as the Two Greeks, were built by whale-oil magnate William Hadwen in 1846 and 1847. One is now a house museum offering a glimpse into the heady days of the island's whaling era, while the other—which features a ballroom with a circular oculus open to the sky—is now a private home. Hadwen was a silversmith from Newport, Rhode Island who first visited the island for the wedding of his cousin Nathaniel Barney. He fell for the bride's sister and decided to stay on the island, teaming up with Barney to run a candle factory and whale-oil refinery that now houses the great Nantucket Whaling Museum.

Sea Captain Edward Penniman's Trophy Home

Wealthy sea captain Edward Penniman built his grand French Second Empire trophy house in the seaside town of Eastham in 1868. Now a museum, the mansion is open for tours highlighting the Cape's whaling era. Penniman (1831-1913), who grew up nearby and married the girl across the street, set out on his first whaling voyage at age 21. Most of the whales in the Northeast had been killed by the mid-1800s, so New Bedford whale hunters were forced to sail to such faraway places as Hawaii, New Zealand, and the Arctic. With each expedition lasting about three years, Penniman spent 22 years at sea.

Address: 309 Bound Brook Way, Wellfleet Price: Rental rates may vary Contact: capemodern trust@gmail Wellfleet's modernist Hatch House, perched on a bluff overlooking Cape Cod Bay, was built in 1962 for Robert Hatch, an editor of the Nation, and his wife Ruth, a painter. Designed by self-taught architect Jack Hall, the 784-square-foot cottage is a matrix of three cubes connected by outdoor decks. An outdoor hallway connects the main living area with the bedroom cubes. The experimental house, stocked with the Hatch family's original furniture, books, and paintings, is available for tours and rustic summer getaways (though keep in mind there is no internet, heat, laundry or dishwasher) with the Cape Cod Modern House Trust.



Price: Rental rates may vary Contact: capemodern trust@gmail While the Cape is known for grand sea captain's homes and salt-worn beach cottages, the town of Wellfleet was once an enclave of mid-century modern architecture. About 95 of these avant-garde houses with flat roofs, boxlike shapes, and expansive windows are still scattered through the Wellfleet woods, many designed by the European modernist architects who flocked to the area in the 1940s. Four have been restored by the Cape Cod Modern House Trust, offering tours, summer rentals, and artist-in-residence programs: the 1962 Hatch House and the 1970 Charles Zehnder-designed Kugel/Gips House.



It is a travel guide that should be used while traveling, so it's necessary that the book is on the smaller side for portability.

Paper

28.76 M Weight

Reasoning

The paper should be matte, and thicker than regular printer paper, so the content of the double sided page is not seen from the other side. It was also used for the professional element.

The cover and back cover is a slightly heavier paper weight than the interior pages.

Saddle Stitching




